Biography: Robert Martin “Bob” Fink was born in New York on 29 December 1935. He earned a music degree from Wayne State University in Detroit, where he also worked as a graphic artist. He moved to Saskatoon in his 30’s, where he lived for the rest of his life.

Bob was a composer, and in addition wrote extensively on music, and the history of music. He published a journal, *Crosscurrents*, and published his music under the series name of *Some New Olde Music*. Most of his publications were available on his website, Greenwych.

He was a social activist as well as a musicologist, and won a precedent-setting case for the right to poster in public locations. He also worked as an artist and illustrator, journalist, and machinery designer.

Bob Fink died on 8 September 2016.

Scope and Content: This fonds contains the books and articles Bob Fink wrote, mainly relating to music, and particularly on his theories on the evolution and origin of music. It includes the other half of the collection is copies of sheet music which he composed, mainly under the series name “Some New Olde Music” as well as the opera *Lysistrata*. It has been published individually as well as in collections. There are also some recordings on a variety of media (CD, cassette, and reel to reel) which appear to contain recordings of Bob Fink playing his compositions.

Bob Fink kept an extensive website filled with the articles he wrote on a wide variety of topics. It also contains links to articles he collected that were of interest to him and related to his areas of study. It also contains MIDI’s of the music he composed. II. Neanderthal flute

This series includes material on the "Stages in the Evolution of Music Scale and Harmony" a different but related essay by Fink. They have been put in the same series because the "Stages..." publication was often filed with the Neanderthal flute one, suggesting a connection. Reorganized to bring scattered copies and duplicates together. Excess duplicates also discarded.

IX. Lysistrata

Fink wrote this opera as a protest to the Vietnam war. It was published in 1979. It was to be performed at Wayne State University in 1968 (from which Fink earned his degree in musicology and the sciences (incl. anthropology). This updated version of the play was cancelled when the tenor was drafted into the army 4 days before the performance. The opera director got cold feet about its anti-Vietnam war protest libretto, and used the tenor's draft notice as an excuse to perform the opera in a small room with a new unrehearsed tenor, but no room for a normal-sized audience. That was unacceptable censorship to the composer who then withdrew the opera. [From Fink's Greenwich website]
