

MG 689 – D.T. Willis fonds

Dates: 1929-1944 (inclusive).

Extent: 20 cm of textual records, 13 photographs, memorabilia; some oversize.

Biography: Douglas Theodore Willis was born in Dauphin, Manitoba, in 1911. The family moved to Saskatchewan, where he attended high school in Prince Albert, graduating in 1929. That same year he began studies at the University of Saskatchewan, graduating in 1934 with a B.Sc Engineeing (Civil). In 1938 he married Helen Swain, whom he had met while both were USask students. Douglas joined the army as an officer in the Royal Canadian Engineers, serving from 1942-1946. His professional career took him to Manitoba, Ontario, Atlantic Canada and British Columbia; and beginning in 1964, he served as a United Nations Technical Expert (UNTAB) on various international assignments, including Kuwait, Indonesia, Saudi Arabia, and Cyprus. Helen died in 1981, and Douglas returned to Canada in 1982. He died in 1986.

Scope and content: This fonds contains material relating to Doug Willis' student days at the University of Saskatchewan, notably as an athlete; and material relating to his military career.

Arrangement: It has been organized into three series:

- 1. University of Saskatchewan Athletics
- 2. University of Saskatchewan Engineering
- 3. Military Service.

Restrictions: There are no restrictions on access.
