MG 645 - Fleming Family fonds

Dates: ca. 1890s-2016 (inclusive). – 1918-1990s (predominant).

Extent: 1.42 metres of textual records, 180 photographs, 47 negatives, 15 postcards, 26 45 rpm vinyl records, 16 audio reel tapes, 3 audio cassette tapes, 1 CD.

Biography: Arthur Evelyn Fleming was born in July 1864 in England. He married Helen May (née Murray) in 1892; they had six children: Arthur Guy Murray (1893-1936), Eric Berkeley (1896 -1979); Robert Bruce (1900-1968); Dorothy May Fleming Price (1901-1958); Alleyne Berkeley Fleming Mumford (1906-1981); and Elma Balance Fleming Wallis (1909-1999). Arthur served as minor Canon and Precentor, Gloucester Cathedral and died on 29 May 1922 in Gloucester, England.

Their son, Eric Berkeley, married Georgina Milliken Inness (née Gunn) in 1920. Although it is not clear when Eric left England, he and Georgina were living in Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, by the time of the birth of their first child, Robert James Berkely, in 1921. Together Eric and Georgina had four children: Robert, William Arthur, Peg, and Barbara.

Scope and Content: This fonds contains the original musical scores and arrangements, and related teaching material, programs, posters and recital material from multiple generations of the Fleming family, primarily those by Arthur Evelyn Fleming (1864-1922), Robert James Berkeley Fleming (1921 – 1976), William Arthur Fleming (1933-2016), and Robert's son Berkeley Fleming. Georgina Gunn Fleming, Robert's wife Margaret Pound, Robert may have been the most well-known as a composer, pianist, organist, choirmaster and teacher; but William ("Bill"), a teacher-librarian who taught in Regina throughout his career, was also an acclaimed singer and choirmaster, and studied at the University of Saskatchewan under Murray Adaskin, and Frances James Adaskin. The fonds contains musical works by others in a variety of musical genres; as well as family correspondence, photographs, and memorabilia.

Restrictions: There are no restrictions on access.

Due to the interconnected nature of this fonds (each member of the family writing letters to each other) the decision was made to put correspondence *written* by Eric/Gina/Robert/William was put into their own sub-series, not in the series of the person it was sent to. This does not apply to people outside that family group, and that correspondence was put in the recipients' sub-series.
