



MG 149 – Flora Roy fonds

Dates: 1931-1945 (inclusive) ; 1937-1938 (predominant).

Extent: 12.7 cm of textual records.

Biography: Flora Roy attended the University of Saskatchewan intermittently between 1931 and 1938; she later attended the University of Toronto. During her academic career she earned a PhD and was awarded a DLitt. Dr. Roy taught at Wilfred Laurier University, where she was given the status of Professor Emeritus upon her retirement.

Scope and Content: This collection contains lecture notes taken by Dr. Roy while she was a student at the University of Saskatchewan. Predominately from English classes, these include notes on lectures given by Professors R.A. Wilson, J.M. Lothian, J.A. Bentley, Edith Brown, Jean Bayer, Murdoch Matheson, and Carlyle King. Included also are notes from a summer school art history class, taught at Emma Lake; and an English course from the University of Toronto.

Arrangement: This collection has been organized into 2 series:
