Dates: 1991-2000 (inclusive).

Administrative history: The Interagency Council on Survivor Services (I.C.S.S.) was a coalition concerned with providing services to adult survivors of child sexual abuse. The council consisted of private practitioners, physicians, social workers, metal health workers from public and non-governmental agencies and people working in the survival self-help movement. The I.C.S.S. was initiated by the Executive Director of the Saskatoon Family Services Bureau in June on 1992 and ceased operation in early 2000.

Scope and content: This fonds contains agenda, minutes, correspondence and reports.

Restrictions: Files marked as **RESTRICTED** require vetting by the archivist.
