

# MG 104 – Marguerita Spencer fonds

Dates: 1900-1987 (inclusive); 1923-1987 (predominant)

Extent: 60 cm of textual records; 11 negatives; 16 photographs; 3 VHS; 2 reel-to-reel audio tapes.

**Biography:** The eleventh of twelve children, Marguerita Spencer was born 28 December 1892 into the musical MacQuarrie family of Glace Bay, Nova Scotia. Her early musical education was split between Glace Bay and Halifax's Academy of Music, Lady's College. During World War I, Marguerita returned to Glace Bay where she found work improvising piano accompaniment to silent films. From 1918 to 1921 Miss MacQuarrie lived in Toronto where she trained as a nurse at the city's General Hospital. Shortly after graduation in 1921, she married R.A. Spencer who had been recently appointed Assistant Professor of Civil Engineering at the University of Saskatchewan. After moving to Saskatoon, Mrs. Spencer continued her musical education both locally under Lyell Gustin and at McGill's Department of Music where she earned a L. Mus. degree. Spencer was extremely active in the Saskatoon s music community, joining the Knox United Church Choir, playing organ for both the Westminster United and the First Baptist churches, performing with the Saskatoon Symphony and on CBC radio, and taking on students of her own. She was not only a gifted player but also a composer of music. A theme that runs through much of her work is that the prairies and its people. Mrs. Spencer has composed and published songs and suites for voice, string quartets, piano and cello. She passed away May 5, 1993.

**Scope and content**: This fonds contains personal correspondence with family, colleagues, and publishers; prose and music compositions; material pertaining to provincial music associations, festivals, performances, and recitals; etc.
