

an exchange of locks for someone who has not kept his combination confidential. Students who tamper with other's lockers and **seek or give out information regarding combinations** make themselves an **automatic suspect** and will be the first to be questioned in case of theft. Theft is a criminal offence. **Lockers must never be left unlocked and students must pay for lost or damaged locks.** Sharing lockers is **prohibited.**

2. General School Property

Students are expected to treat public property with respect. Marking books, lockers, walls, etc. will not be tolerated.

Parking

The WEST side of the school is for **staff parking.** Students may park in the area **facing** the swimming pool or in the area close to the arena. It is of utmost importance that private driveways on 7th street NOT be blocked. **Cars** parked in restricted areas will be towed away at the owners expense. Generally speaking, we discourage students from bringing cars to school.

4. Smoking

The school discourages students from smoking nor does the school have a smoking facility. Smoking will not be allowed inside the **school building.** We **strongly urge** students not to congregate on the area adjoining the residential property west of the school. This causes inconvenience for the residents. Students may smoke anywhere on the school grounds north of the building. **Smoking between classes is forbidden.**

EVALUATION AND PROMOTION

Promotion in any subject will depend on several factors:

- a) attendance and attitude
- b) satisfactory completion of class assignments
- c) class room tests
- d) a final examination

Although students are judged on the basis of continuous evaluation we also place **considerable emphasis on final examinations.**

ALCOHOL AND DRUGS

Trafficking in or possession of drugs is a Criminal offense. Anyone involved with alcohol or drugs within the school premises will be subject to automatic suspension until the next meeting of the school board, and will be turned over to the proper authorities. Student guilty of offences whether it be within the school or some school sponsored activity run a serious risk of making themselves ineligible for any year-end student awards. The problems of alcohol and drugs is a serious one and will be dealt with severely.

IN SCHOOL AND EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

a) In School (Internation)

All students are assigned to a 'house' at the beginning of the school year. Students are urged to get into the spirit of participating. Success of the program is determined by student co-operation.

b) Extra-Curricular Activities

A variety of activities are available for students. Students should familiarize themselves with the activities and choose

one or more. Do not choose all activities, use common sense.

JANITORIAL STAFF

The janitorial staff will operate all thermostats and lights. Students can make the work of the custodial staff much easier by:

- a) making sure footwear is very clean.
- b) avoid throwing paper on lockers, on the floor or in desks
- c) use the waste paper receptacles.
- d) keeping the tops of desks free of writing and other marks
- e) keeping washrooms tidy.
- f) making sure lockers are kept neat.

STUDENT SERVICES OFFICER

Mr. Gibson will devote half of his time to student counselling and guidance. Students should feel free to consult Mr. Gibson during his hours in the Student Services Office.

LIBRARY

The library is a place for study, reading and research. It is not a meeting place, nor is it a place for discussion and gossip. Students are asked to observe strict silence in this area. The librarian is in control and has the authority to deal with students who do not adhere to library regulations. Library privileges will be suspended for those students who detract from making the library a quiet place in which to work.
