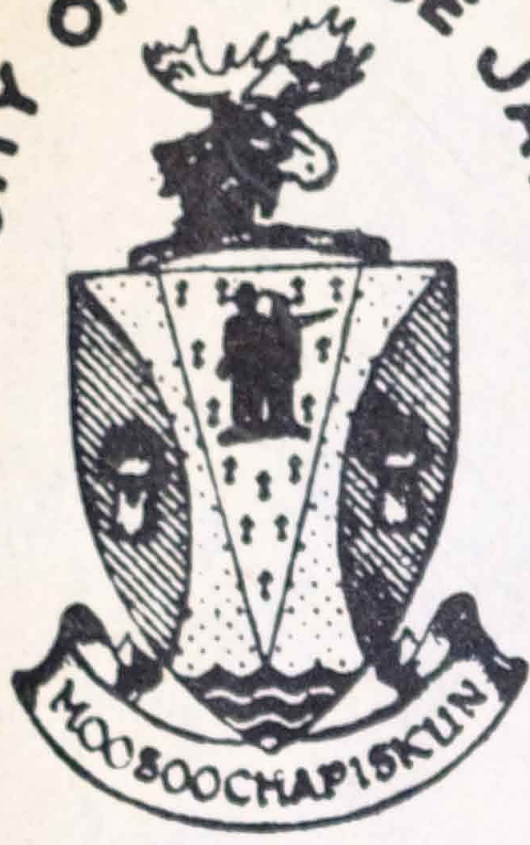

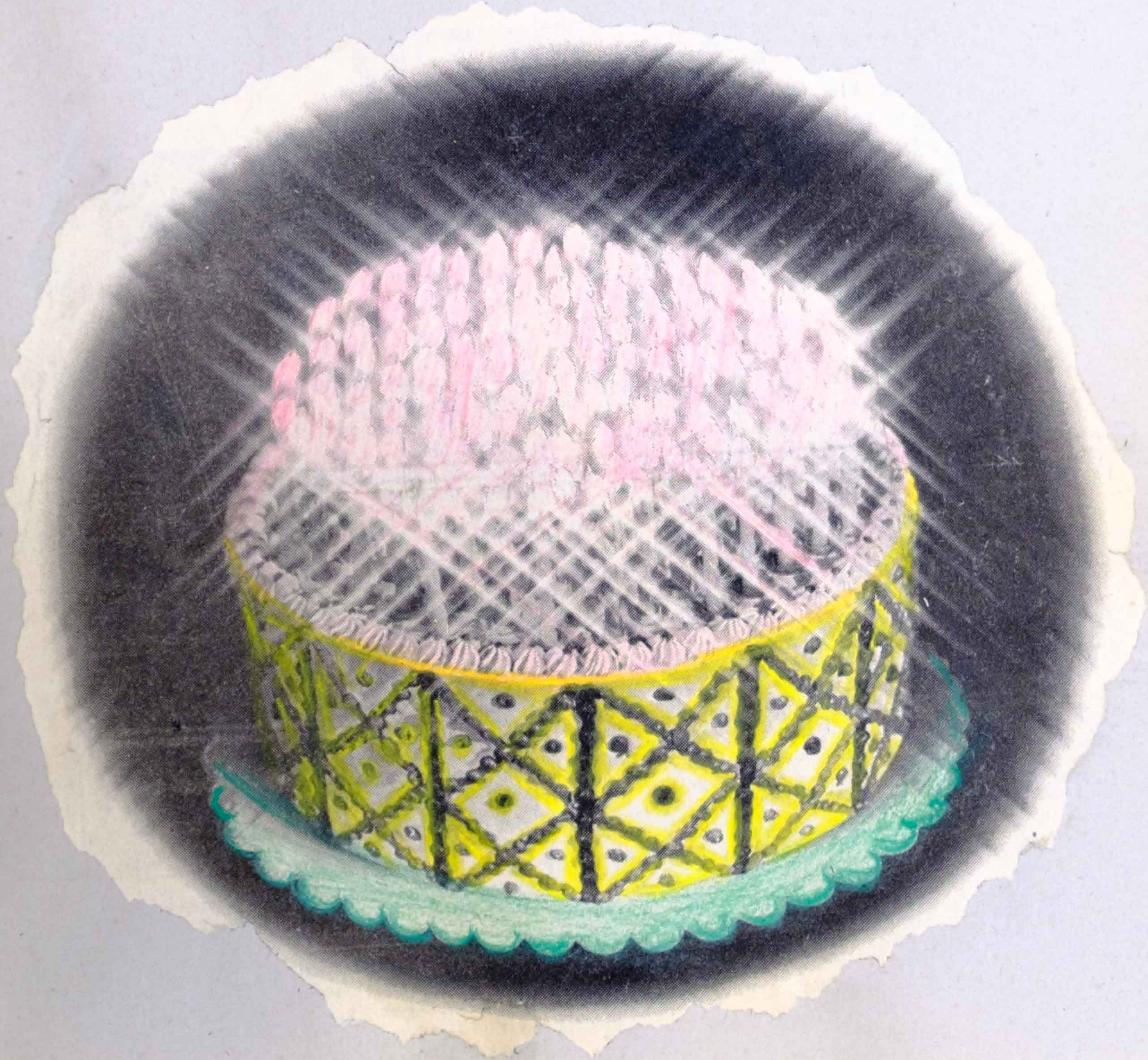

Royal family arrives in Regina

REGINA (CP) — The Queen, Prince Philip and their youngest son, Prince Edward, touched down smoothly at Regina Airport Friday evening aboard a Canadian Armed Forces Boeing 707 from Stephenville, Nfld.

There was virtually no crowd to watch Lt.-Gov. Irwin McIntosh and Transport Minister Otto Lang greet the Royal visitors under grey clouds.

The Queen, dressed in a blue print dress, chose an open white car for the trip to the Saskatchewan Legislature, following a route lined with a smattering of spectators.

Prince Philip accompanied the Queen while Prince Edward followed behind in a closed grey limousine.

PREMIER GREETINGS

A sizeable crowd at the legislative grounds watched as Premier Allan Blakeney welcomed the royal visitors, saying the people of the province looked forward to expressing their loyalty, respect and warm affection.

An honor guard of militia from units in Western Canada was inspected by the Queen and the Air Command Band from Canadian Forces Base Winnipeg played God Save the Queen and the national anthem.

A 21-gun salute resounded across Wascana Lake as the Queen inspected the honor guard and was introduced to provincial dignitaries by the premier.

She last visited the province for the 100th anniversary of the RCMP in 1973.

Today, she travels by train to a number of small Saskatchewan communities before returning to Regina for a provincial banquet to be followed by a concert at the centre of the arts.

She goes to Moose Jaw and Saskatoon Sunday.

Train ride planned to smaller towns

REGINA (CP) — When the Queen and Prince Philip go touring some of Saskatchewan's smaller communities today they'll be doing it in comfortable, 11-year-old cars.

The Royal tour goes to Fort Qu'Appelle, Balcarres, Melville and Yorkton before returning to Regina for a provincial-city dinner and concert at the centre of the arts. At each community, the train will be met by local officials and the public. A multi-cultural performance will be presented at Yorkton.

The train will travel slowly along the route to Yorkton, giving the royal couple ample opportunity to see the countryside and the people along the way.

The rail cars on the train include a sitting room and individual berths for the Royal couple and dignitaries with them. There is also a dining car where the travellers will have a lunch of fillets of sole.

Premier Allan Blakeney and Mrs. Blakeney, Federal Transport Minister Otto Lang and Mrs. Lang and Lorne Nystrom, NDP MP for Yorkton-Melville and Mrs. Nystrom will join the Royal couple on the train.
