(Mike) Murdock, who passed away with tragic suddenness at his home, 421 Ross St. W., at the age of 64 years.

A native son of North Onslow, Que., the deceased was educated in separate schools and at the University of Ottawa, and resided in that city for 12 years before he moved west to Moose Jaw in 1905. Here he was later appointed agent for the Massey-Harris company. He disposed of the business at the close of 1945 to Lambert and Horno, formerly of Regina.

Mr. Murdock was appointed a justice of the peace for the province in 1920 and for several years had been secretary of the Moose Jaw Old Timers' Association. He is survived by his widow, three daughters, Mrs. Gordon Deagle, Archydal, Mrs. J. E. Dunn, Moose Jaw, and Mrs. A. H. Cochrane, Winnipeg; three sisters, Mrs. Rose Halvorsen, and Mrs. Agnes Allen, both residing at Quyon, Que., and Mrs. Jennie Allen, at Covina, Cal.; one brother, Patrick Murdock, at Quyon, Que., and one grandson, Charles Deagle.

Mr. Murdock was active in tennis and badminton circles for a number of years, and was a past president of the Moose Jaw Badminton Association. He was also a keen follower of hockey and rarely missed a senior game in Moose Jaw.
