They lived near the towns of Ballymevy and Antrim, not far from Belfast. Samuel and Catherine were married on the 15 September 1854, and after their marriage, they sailed to Albany,

New York, where George was born on the 16 February 1856. From Albany, New York, Samuel and Catherine first came to Hamilton, Ontario, where Samuel was employed as a shoe maker. In 1879, when land opened or became available in Huron County, Samuel and Catherine purchased land in McKillop Township, which is near Seaforth, Ontario. Their farm was located at Walton, Ontario. In 1890, they sold their farm, and moved West to Saskatchewan, and settled North-West of Moose Jaw in the Archydal district. They lived on the 5/2 of Sec 34 - Twp 17 - Range 28 - W2nd Meridian. They are buried in the Moose Jaw Cemetery.
