Dear Dr. Wheeler,

Replying to your letter of December 30th, 1930, with regard to your request for permission to sell a limited quantity of elite Marquis wheat and Victory oats, the opinion of the executive is that the general sale of elite must stop, owing to the fact that it is materially injuring the older members of the Association and thus undermining the whole structure of the organization. It is felt that a certain amount of stock should change hands among the breeder members and the Committee feels that permission should be given to this extent. Where a grower has unsolicited orders for a small quantity of stocks which are going to other growers for the purpose of improving their stocks, or in instances where a grower has had the misfortune to lose his registered crop and must begin with new stock, it is only fair that some other grower should be given the privilege of supplying same should his stocks be suitable for such a purpose. However, the solicited business by way of advertising is decidedly detrimental to the Association and is in conflict with its policy and, under such conditions, permission will not be given by the executive for the sale of elite.
